Attachment to Articles of Incorporation

**ATTACHMENT TO
ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
SANCTUARY POINTE HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC.**

The following provisions are hereby attached to and made a part of the Articles of Incorporation of Sanctuary Pointe Homeowners Association, Inc., a Colorado non-profit corporation (the "Association").

5. Voting. The Association shall have voting members as provided in the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, Restrictions and Easements for Sanctuary Pointe (the "Declaration") and the Bylaws of the Association. Cumulative voting is prohibited.

6. Distribution of Assets on Dissolution. Upon the dissolution of the Association, the assets of the Association shall be disposed of according to the procedure outlined in the Colorado Revised Nonprofit Corporation Act.

7. Additional Provisions.

7.1 Purposes. The purposes and objectives for which this Association is formed (none of which shall be for pecuniary profit) are set forth in the Bylaws of the Association and in the Declaration.

7.2 Restrictions Upon the Powers. This Association is not organized for profit. No Member, member of the Board of Directors, or person from whom the Association may receive any property or funds, shall receive or shall be lawfully entitled to receive any pecuniary profit from the operations thereof; and in no event shall any part of the funds or assets of the Association be paid as salary or compensation to, or distributed to, or inure to the benefit of, any Member of the Board of Directors. The foregoing, however, shall neither prevent nor restrict the following: (1) reasonable compensation may be paid to any Member or Director while acting as an agent or employee of the Association for services rendered in affecting one or more of the purposes of the Association, and (2) any member or Director may, from time to time, be reimbursed for his or her actual and reasonable expenses incurred in connection with the administration of the affairs of the Association.

7.3 Board of Directors. The management of the affairs of the Association shall be vested in a Board of Directors. The number of directors, their term of office and manner of their selection and election shall be determined according to the Declaration and the Bylaws of the Association from time to time in force.

7.4 Bylaws. The initial bylaws of the Association shall be as adopted by the Board of Directors. Such board shall have power to alter, amend or repeal the bylaws from time to time in force and to adopt new bylaws. Such bylaws may contain any provisions for the regulation or management of the affairs of the Association which are not inconsistent with the laws of the

State of Colorado, the Declaration, or these Articles of Incorporation, as the same may from time to time be amended.

7.5 Indemnification.

7.5.1 The Association shall indemnify every Director, Officer, agent or employee, and any former Director, Officer, agent or employee against loss, cost, and expense, including counsel fees reasonably incurred in connection with any action, suit, or proceeding to which such person may be made a party by reason of being, or having been such Director, Officer, agent or employee of the Association, except as to matters as to which such person shall be finally adjudged to be liable for gross negligence, willful misconduct or fraud.

7.5.2 No indemnification shall be provided for acts constituting gross negligence, fraud, or willful misconduct.
